



Traineeship / Apprenticeship Pathway Program

Overview

Are you wanting an apprenticeship or traineeship but unsure where to start?

Are you looking for an edge over others looking for the same type of employment?

This pathway program may be the entry point you are looking for.



This program has the potential to link you with apprenticeship / traineeship employment with Central Coast Group Training (CCGT).

CCGT is the largest local employer of apprentices and trainees with 160+ employed each year.

ET Australia and CCGT have partnered to deliver this pathway program which will provide you with foundation knowledge and many transferrable skills that will be valuable in an entry level traineeship or apprenticeship role.

The training, delivered by ET Australia, will provide you with a fantastic opportunity to get a foot in the door and showcase yourself for a traineeship or apprenticeship with CCGT. CCGT will use the program to screen applicants for traineeship / apprenticeship employment. If, during the program, a student displays the qualities and attributes an employer is looking for in their next trainee or apprentice, CCGT will work with the student to place them with that employer. Please note, there are no guarantees of employment, offers of employment will be made by CCGT at their discretion.

This pathway program will assist you in making a well-informed decision if you are offered traineeship or apprenticeship employment.

CCGT place their apprentices and trainees with local employers. CCGT work with many local employers across the Central Coast region, employers who are seeking their next apprentice or trainee. These local employers work across a variety of industries, and each has differing needs as to what they require in an apprentice or

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trainee. They could be looking for an apprentice plumber, or they could be looking for an office administration trainee.

This pathway program is fully subsidised by the NSW Government (eligibility criteria applies).

Entry Requirements

All applicants must attend an information session and an interview for selection into the program.

It is recommended that students have:

- Sound digital skills eg to conduct online research
- Developed communication skills
- Sound literacy and numeracy skills
- A commitment to complete designated students outside of the face-to-face training sessions
- A genuine desire to transition into traineeship or apprenticeship employment with CCGT

Applicants must have a willingness and desire to learn.

Applicants must be prepared to dedicate time outside of the classroom sessions to complete learning and assessment activities. The amount of time required will vary from person to person and will also be dependent upon the unit of study as some units are more comprehensive than others.

Students undertaking the program will need access to a digital device such as a laptop with an internet connection to complete the in-class activities and the at home learning and assessment activities.

Please note, we are encouraging all students who will be present onsite to be fully vaccinated with two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine.

Eligibility for a Subsidised Training Place

This training is **fully** subsidised by the NSW Government under the Smart & Skilled initiative.

To be eligible for a Smart and Skilled subsidised training place, at the time of enrolment an individual must:

- Be an Australian citizen, a permanent Australian resident, a humanitarian visa holder or a New Zealand citizen, and
- Be aged 15 years or older, and
- Live or work in New South Wales, and
- No longer be at school or equivalent

Further Study

Students who are successful with traineeship or apprenticeship employment will complete a related vocational qualification as part of their traineeship or apprenticeship employment.


Where can I obtain additional information?
