Overview

The aged care sector offers a great career path for anyone who wants to work in a growth industry. The industry is consistently growing and requires workers in different areas and levels of expertise.

If you see yourself making a difference in another person's life, and you want a job with great personal satisfaction as well as flexible hours, then a career in aged care could be for you. Get fee-FREE training in this rewarding and growing industry!

This program has been designed to meet an industry need for entry level care support workers in the aged care sector. Students will learn how to meet the personal support needs of the older person, support their independence and well-being, use safe working practices for direct care work, and will learn how to work effectively in the aged care sector. Classroom-based learning combined with work placement provides the foundations required to work with older people.

Entry Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification however, all successful applicants will be required to:

Undertake a criminal history check

The Australian Government Department of Health and Ageing requires that any person who provides care within an aged care service must have a police check prior to being present 'on site'. Students must not have previous convictions which would exclude them from working in the aged care sector as outlined in the Aged Care Act 1997 (murder, sexual assault, any other form of assault which has resulted in a sentence of imprisonment or any other conviction which would be considered, on the basis of risk and relevance, to render them unsuitable for a vocational placement in an aged care setting). The cost of this check will be covered by ET Australia.

Formally apply

All applicants are required to attend an information session, complete an application form and must attend an interview for selection into the program. Interviews are conducted with each applicant to determine their suitability for the program and to ensure the program meets their career aspirations.

Commit to complete at home study

Students must be prepared to undertake learning and assessment activities outside of the scheduled face-to-face classroom training sessions. As a guide, students should expect to spend as many hours outside of the classroom as they do inside the classroom to complete additional learning and assessment activities.

Provide evidence of vaccination

Our partnering host work placement facilities require evidence from each student to show that they have had a 2022 influenza vaccination, and COVID-19 vaccination (ie fully vaccinated with the required number of doses).

Physical attributes

Functional capacity and fitness to perform the tasks and duties necessary to work in the aged care sector including physical capability to perform CPR for 2 minutes on a mannequin placed on the floor.

Digital skills

Sound digital skills are needed as students will be required to undertake activities such as using the internet to conduct research, send / receive emails.

Language, literacy and numeracy

Sound language, literacy and numeracy skills are required and it is recommended that applicants have good communication and interpersonal skills.

Is this the right course for you?

Aged care work can be challenging, and to be prepared for the course, we recommend you have:

- A genuine passion for working with elderly people.
- Strong empathy, patience, understanding and a desire to work with vulnerable people.
- A demonstrated level of maturity and discretion to complete the practical components of the program.

Work Placement

All applicants must be prepared to participate in work placement.

Participation in a minimum of 120 hours of work placement is required to successfully complete the qualification. Work placement venues are organised by ET Australia.

Further Study

Students who successfully complete this qualification may choose to further their studies;

- Higher level study in a related area such as CHC43015 Certificate IV in Ageing Support.
- CHC33015 Certificate III in Individualised Support e.g. Disability or Home and Community specialisations.
- Specialised qualifications at a higher AQF level from the Community Services Training Package.

Course Structure

This program combines classroom-based sessions with 2 work placement blocks in an industry facility.

Students are required to participate in all scheduled classes unless arranged otherwise with an ET Australia Representative. Students are required to complete a minimum of 120 hours of practical placement in an aged care setting. This is mandatory for successful completion of the qualification. The 120 hours will be achieved during the scheduled work placement blocks.

Training Days:	Tuesdays, Wednesdays
Dates:	23 August 2022 – 28 March 2023 There will be no training over the Christmas / New Year period. The last day of class for 2022 will be 14 December and class will return 10 January 2023. Please note, if 120 hours of work placement hours aren't achieved during this training period, students will have the opportunity to continue the work placement to complete the remaining hours.
Venue:	Young Parents Hub, 2A Amy Close, Wyong (for classroom-based sessions) Host work placement venues to be confirmed.
Times:	9.00am to 3.00pm (except for first aid training which is 9.00am to 4.00pm and during work placement where earlier start times of 6.30am may be necessary).

Assessments

Students must successfully complete all assessment activities for each unit to achieve the qualification. A variety of assessment techniques will be used.

Types of assessment activities include question and answer activities, case studies, simulations, workbook activities, projects and practical on the job activities.

Completion of at least 120 hours of work placement is necessary for successful completion of the qualification.

Eligibility

To get *fee-free training under JobTrainer, people must

1. Meet the Smart and Skilled eligibility as outlined below:

- 15 years old and over
- No longer at school
- Living or working in NSW
- An Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen.

and

2. Be one (or more) of the following:

- Job seeker. This includes someone who is unemployed, on income support payments or expected to become unemployed
- Young person (including school leaver) aged 16-24, regardless of employment status
- NSW veteran and their recognised partner or spouse
- Any individual (including an employed person) seeking fee-free* training in specific full and part qualifications in:
 - aged care.

Support

The Trainer / Assessor is also available at the end of each class day for additional learning / assessment support.

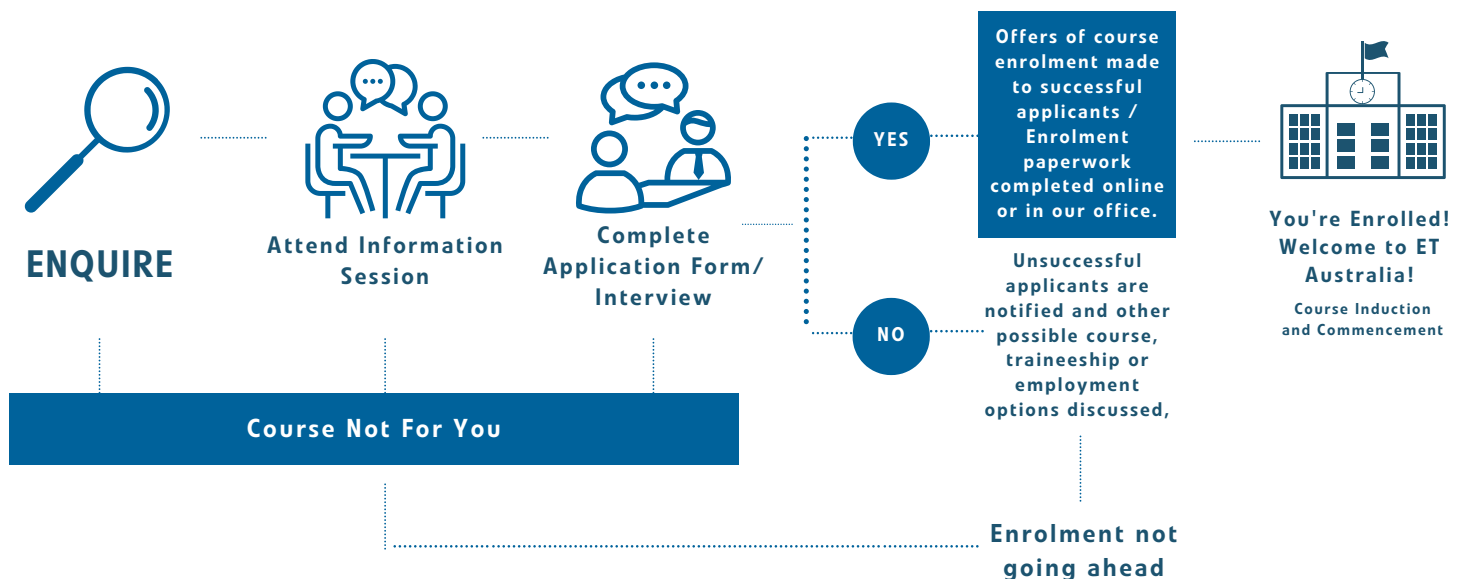
